


How to Calculate Your Bangle Size

A) Measure A Bangle that You Already Own and Fits Well

Measure the **inside diameter** of the bangle with a ruler and then look at the equivalent circumference above.

B) Measure Your Hand

- 1. Make your hand as small as possible, as if you were putting on a bangle, bringing your thumb and little finger together in your palm.
- 2. Using a tape measure, (or a long strip of paper) measure around your hand at the widest point (usually around your knuckles) making sure the tape measure/strip of paper is pulled tight. Make a note of this measurement (which will be the actual circumference of your hand) or, if using paper, make a mark where the paper meets, then measure the length of the paper with your ruler to get your hand circumference.
- 3. Compare your hand circumference to the bangle circumference in the above chart. it is usually best to buy a bangle which is slightly bigger than your actual hand measurement so the bangle is comfortable, but not so big that it will slip easily over your hand and fall off.

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
